"Whoever eats the bread or drinks the cup of the Lord in an unworthy manner will be guilty of sinning against the body and blood of the Lord. 


jealous, and thus save some of them. ¹⁵For if their rejection means the reconciliation of the world, what will their acceptance mean but life from the dead? . . .

I believe in one God, the Father Almighty, maker of heaven and earth and of all things visible and invisible.




Preface LSB 208


